We share personal challenges and successes with each other, which stimulates the way that I think and perceive my work. We are more than simply colleagues, but deep friendships have resulted from our times together.

I am driven by my strong feelings and dedication to the future of psychoanalysis, which is the reason I am involved with several committees and sections within APsA. These include the Public Information Committee, the Ethics Committee, the DPE Child Analysis Section, the DPE Diversities Section, the Candidates Subcommittee Psychoanalyst in the Community, the Social Issues Department's Gender and Sexuality Committee and the Study Group Psychoanalysis and Neuroscience.

I currently serve as the Candidates' Liaison Editor for The American Psychoanalyst (TAP), a journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association (APsA) and the APsA's Candidate Council as Chairperson for the Child and Adolescent Analysis Committee.

On a personal note, I enjoy reading, hiking, singing and traveling around the globe. Currently I am working on creating podcasts vulgarizing psychoanalytical jargon to make it more accessible to all. These podcasts will raise awareness among the general public of who we are and what we are doing so that psychoanalysis will not be reserved for the more privileged.

Should I be elected, I promise to work at encouraging progressive thinking and opportunities for each to share their ideas and opinions. Too often as candidates, we find ourselves frustrated, alone and isolated because the challenges we face can be overwhelming or even shameful.
